





We're making it right in East Palestine and fulfilling our long-term commitments to address water testing, housing, and health. To date, we have contributed more than \$103 million to East Palestine and the surrounding area and conducted thousands of tests in conjunction with the U.S and Ohio EPA that show the air and water are safe.

## **ENVIRONMENTAL TESTING AND MONITORING**

We have been working hard with local, state, and federal authorities to help ensure the community is safe. The steps we've taken include:



**42M+ gallons** of impacted water recovered and transported offsite



\$4.3M state-of-the-art carbon filtration system for the municipal water supply to ensure the Village drinking water remains safe



The Family Assistance Center reimbursed residents, businesses, and schools for air purifiers.



**176,000+ tons** of waste soil shipped off site



**1,200+ drinking water** well samples



**600+ in-home air tests concurrently** with the U.S. EPA

## PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH

We are dedicated to improving the wellbeing of East Palestine residents. Our commitments include:

\$21M in direct financial assistance to local families.

## \$2M+ to establish the State of Ohio medical facility

in East Palestine and reimburse the State of Ohio directly for the care the patients have received at the East Palestine Clinic. The State of Ohio opened the permanent clinic in April of 2023 and has provided accessible medical services and screenings for residents and first responders.

**\$1.8M** in funding to a local East Palestine clinical counseling and wellness practice to support the mental well-being of the local residents surrounding communities.

\$534,000 to fund a state-run Community Resiliency Center to address mental health issues.

Through the **Family Assistance Center (FAC)**, residents have been reimbursed for out of pocket medical bills.

## **A SAFE COMMUNITY**

Making it right means working to keep East Palestine residents safe and ensuring the community's first responders have what they need. Since the incident we have provided:

Funding to establish a new regional safety training center

that will provide ongoing, free training for first responders across the region— at least \$25M to be invested by Norfolk Southern over the next 10 years.

**\$8.5M** to reimburse first responders for all charges related to the derailment, including replacing their Self-Contained Breathing Apparatus (SCBA) air packs and \$2M+ to the East Palestine Fire Department (EPFD) for a new ladder truck.
