LONG-TERM INITIATIVES

Community Support



- ✓ **\$5M** to protect area drinking water with state-of-the-art technology
- ✓ **\$4.2M** to Pennsylvania communities to support local agencies and grants for nonprofits
- ✓ **\$750,000** grant to the East Palestine City School District for development initiatives
- ✓ **\$649,000** to fund an Ohio-run Community Resiliency Center to address mental health issues
- ✓ Restored and donated historic East Palestine Train Depot, and provided **\$100,000** grant
- ✓ **\$25M** Community Health Program providing medical exams and mental health services for the community and first responders for up to 20 years.
- ✓ **\$2M+** to establish the State of Ohio medical facility in East Palestine and reimburse the State of Ohio for care patients received at the East Palestine Clinic.
- ✓ **\$1.8M** in funding to a local East Palestine clinical counseling and wellness practice supporting the mental well-being of local residents.
- ✓ **\$600M** comprehensive settlement agreement for individuals who can use the compensation in any manner they see fit to address potential adverse impacts from the derailment.

Economic Development



- ✓ **\$500,000** grant for the economic development of the village
- ✓ Hosted business open houses to connect local business with resources
- ✓ Hosted an Economic Development Roundtable in partnership with the Ohio Economic Development Authority
- ✓ Launched an interim Home Value Assurance Program (VAP) designed to protect the value of eligible residential properties located in the Village and surrounding communities
- ✓ Opened Norfolk Southern's new field office in East Palestine

Environmental Remediation



- ✓ Completed site-wide soil sampling and majority of site remediation
- ✓ Continued monitoring of air, surface water, groundwater, and drinking water – all results show the air and drinking water in the community are safe
- ✓ Removed large water storage tanks, decommissioned and demobilized equipment, and restoring impacted areas
- ✓ Restored the natural water flows back to Sulphur Run
- ✓ Committed to fully reimburse EPA remediation costs
- ✓ **\$15M** to establish a well water monitoring program
- ✓ **\$6M+** to address pre-existing pollution and improve water quality
- ✓ **74M+** gallons of impacted water recovered and transported offsite
- ✓ **219,000+** tons of waste soil shipped off site
- ✓ **1700+** drinking well water samples
